## **Course Description:**

Applied Design I and II - Emphasizes design elements and principles in the production of applied design art products and/or designs such as architecture, advertisements, graphic designs, environmental designs, and product designs. Stresses proper use of equipment and vocabulary and technical terms. Investigates the computer and its influence on and role in creating contemporary designs. Includes a cultural and historical study of master design works of different periods and styles.

### **Purpose:**

Applied Design I and II course is a level 2 visual art course, students must have taken and passed Visual Art Comprehensive course prior to enrollment.

- Incorporates elements and principles of design to solve specific visual arts
  problems and to communicate ideas and emotions, culminating in a finished
  work of art.
- To provide a sequential, cumulative program of design skills and concepts.
- To provide students the opportunity to engage in higher levels of thinking.
- To promote interdisciplinary art experiences, which help students, integrate ideas, concepts and processes.

## **Creating**

Student engages in the creative process, finds and solves problems and pursues open-ended inquiry through the production of artwork. The student recognizes the impact of art on history and different cultures and how history and culture have influenced art. Through experience in a range of art processes, use of materials, and development of a repertoire of techniques, the student understands the relationship of process, material, and technique to communicate ideas.

### **Sketchbook Assignments**

Students will keep a sketchbook throughout the semester. Students will have weekly sketch assignments that will be graded based on a given rubric. Students should also use the sketchbook independently to gather ideas, images, words, and other design inspiration. It should be a working, planning, idea gather space. The overall sketchbook will count as a project grade toward the end of the semester in addition to the weekly assignments. This artistic participation of the class is important to develop techniques, skills and material experimentation.

#### **Instructional Goals:**

- •To understand the history of design in a variety of fields and use those influences in your original work
- work through sequential stages and processes to exhibit technical skills and craftsmanship.
- develop compositions based on the elements and principles of design.
- investigate various design media
- explore aesthetics
- exhibit an expanded use and understanding of the art vocabulary.
- apply the critical process, Feldman's Theory (describe, analyze, interpret and evaluate) artwork.

#### **Class Rules:**

Students are expected to follow all set school rules and procedures. Be on time to class with necessary materials, ready to learn. Phones are to be used only for music (while working) or researching images Students are expected to clean up after themselves and others and to be respectful of other workspaces
