Class Overview

This course is designed to be a comprehensive introduction to visual art. Students will be introduced to the basic elements of art and principles of design. Students will explore past and current art movements, artists and their impact on our world. Students will create art using a variety of art media in order to gain an understanding of aesthetics, art criticism and art production. Students will be expected to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the language and purpose of art through art creation along with written and oral responses to their own work and the work of others. This course must be successfully completed before taking any other Visual Arts production course.

We will use our sketchbook for weekly assignments as well as in class warms up and media exploration. Purchase a sketchbook that you will enjoy working in throughout the semester and beyond. You may get hard or spiral bound, 100 pages. Try to get paper that will accept both wet and dry materials. You can find these at Walmart, Michaels, Target, etc.

Grading Categories and Weights

Individual scoring rubrics will be used for each area, project, and assignment.

Creating/Producing (40%)

Projects are not optional. They are graded on: following instructions, effort and initiative, originality, and craftsmanship. Keep up with due dates. Only completed work will receive full credit. If you need additional time please meet with me to discuss your needs BEFORE the due date.

Presenting (20%)

This includes sketchbooks and planning documents.

Responding (20%)

Art critiques, written responses, and quizzes. We will do frequent critiques-participation is important.

Connecting (10%)

Demonstrating how skills learned in art transfer to other subjects and other areas of life. A bi-weekly work ethic grade will be given.

Final (10%)

This may be a final project, portfolio or a test
